COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

- ✓ College applications should be in. If not, this should be your top priority.
- ✓ Go online and submit your applications.
- ✓ Your transcript will need to be sent to each college you apply to. Inform Mrs. DeVisser where you need your transcript sent.
- ✓ Some applications require recommendations from a teacher, principal, or counselor.
- ✓ Apply to multiple colleges and make your final decision later.

FINANCIAL AID

- ✓ FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). All students intending to go to college should submit the application beginning October 1. Michigan has an application deadline of March 1. Apply as soon as possible at fafsa.ed.gov. *Even though the state deadline has passed, you can still fill out the FAFSA.*

- ✓ Blood Drive Scholarship ~ To be eligible for this scholarship a student must 1) be a senior, 2) have donated, or attempted to donate blood at least once during his/her high school career, 3) write a 200-300 word essay persuading fellow students to donate blood. 4) scholarship must be used in the Fall of 2020. See the counseling office for a form that must be attached to your typed essay. Deadline: April 24.
